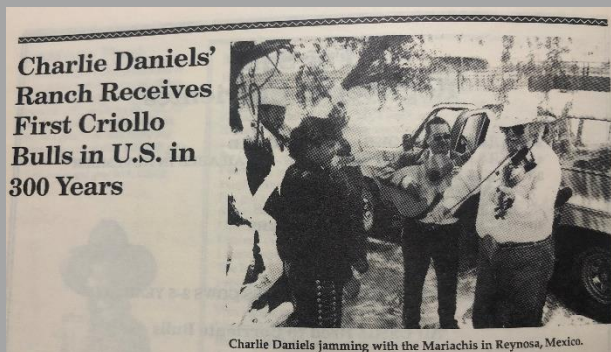
NACA Performance Committee-If you are interested in hosting a NACA sanctioned event, please let us know! We would love to promote your event! The more we can promote together, the better our association will be.

NACA Corriente Lean Beef Committee-If you are selling corriente beef, contact us to get your official trademark label to stick on your packages. We also have brochures for your customers.

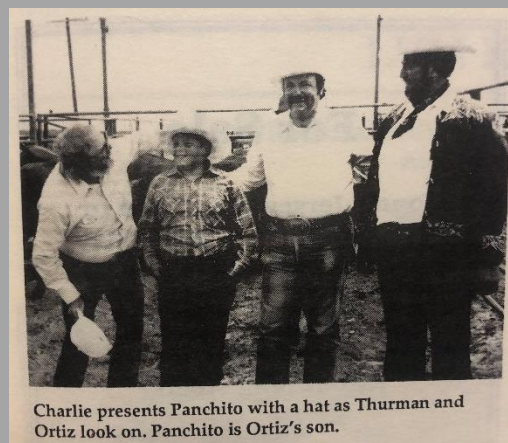

Hello valued members, breeders ,and friends,

Your Board of Directors, Committees, Judges and Executive Director have been working on several new programs. We invite you to attend any and all Committee calls that interest you.



An update on the Certified Corriente Beef Program. The Beef Committee is working diligently to educate and promote Corriente Beef as a whole. The goal here is to add a salvage value to performance and breeding stock to raise the price of your cattle. We are getting close to obtaining the Trademark for this program. The judges and directors have also added a Ready to Market Beef Class to the virtual show. This class will be a work in progress as interest grows. If you have any questions or would like to join the program, please don't hesitate to call Nikki.

From the performance end of things, breeders across the country are seeing an increase in demand thus an increase in value. I believe and the market is showing that we are headed for a much needed increase in value of our performance cattle. Covid-19 delayed this, but it can't stop it. All over the United States and south of the border, purebred herds are fewer and fewer. Most Corriente Breeders have had no choice but to put beef bulls on their cows, if not change breeds entirely. Other unfortunate disasters such as drought and wildfires have also contributed to the current cattle prices. But once the effects of these disasters fade, the cattle market will reset itself. As rodeo comes back, and beef cattle prices rise, so will Corriente demand.

In the meantime, your board and Nikki are making every effort to curve spending and to move the association forward. In this, Nikki came up with the idea for a Virtual Show, an economic and convenient alternative to traditional shows. It was successful in 2021 so it will be returning for 2022. The ruling from the judges and the board is that images and videos can be taken at anytime, so long as the animal meets the requirements of the class at the time that the images are taken and when the images are submitted.

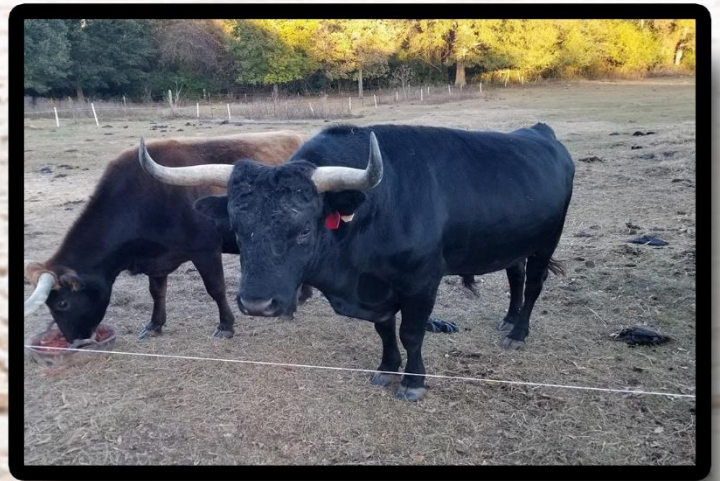

WHY SHOULD I BUY REGISTERED CORRIENTE STOCK?

There are so many reasons for registering your stock and buying registered stock, whether you are a breeder, roper or a beef producer. Here are just some of the reasons:

- **Conservation:** Registries are an essential part of breed conservation.
- **Breeding:** Pedigrees ensure that an animal is purebred and its ancestry is known. This means it will breed true to type and produce consistent, replicable and predictable characteristics in its progeny.
- **Diversity:** Without a registry, you won't be able to find breeders with known quality. The genetics will disappear or become too inbred within a lifetime. Ask China what happened when they put the wall up and couldn't access fresh genetics. If a country can't keep up good genetic lines, you can't on your own ranch. You need other breeders with known quality.
- **Preservation:** To help preserve a historic, but "lightly populated" breed.
- **Purchase:** To guarantee purchase of true, quality, proven Corriente genetics.
- **Health:** To ensure that you are buying healthy, properly vaccinated, domestically raised cattle.
- **Value:** Proven quality and proven genetics means the herd is more valuable than grade roping cattle.
- **Sporting and Performance:** Corriente from registered stock perform better than cattle of mixed or unknown genetic background.
- **Ownership:** Because sometimes it comes in handy to have some proof of ownership for neighbors, insurance, and theft. This isn't legal proof, but it can make a difference.
- **Quality Beef:** To reassure any beef customers that they are getting a true lean-meat, low cholesterol animal, not something of unknown origin and make-up. It's Corriente Beef because we can verify its history and hide color. And now with our Certified Corriente Beef (CCB) program, if that animal is registered, they automatically receive a yellow ear tag (with the CCB logo) when filed at the NACA office.

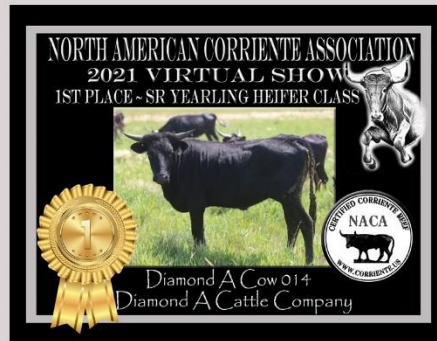
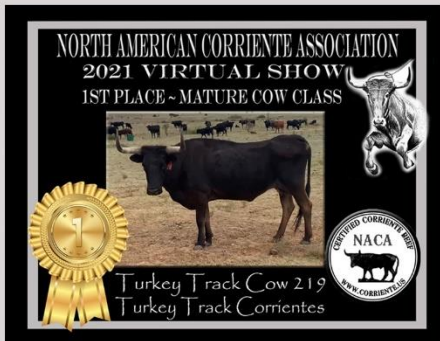

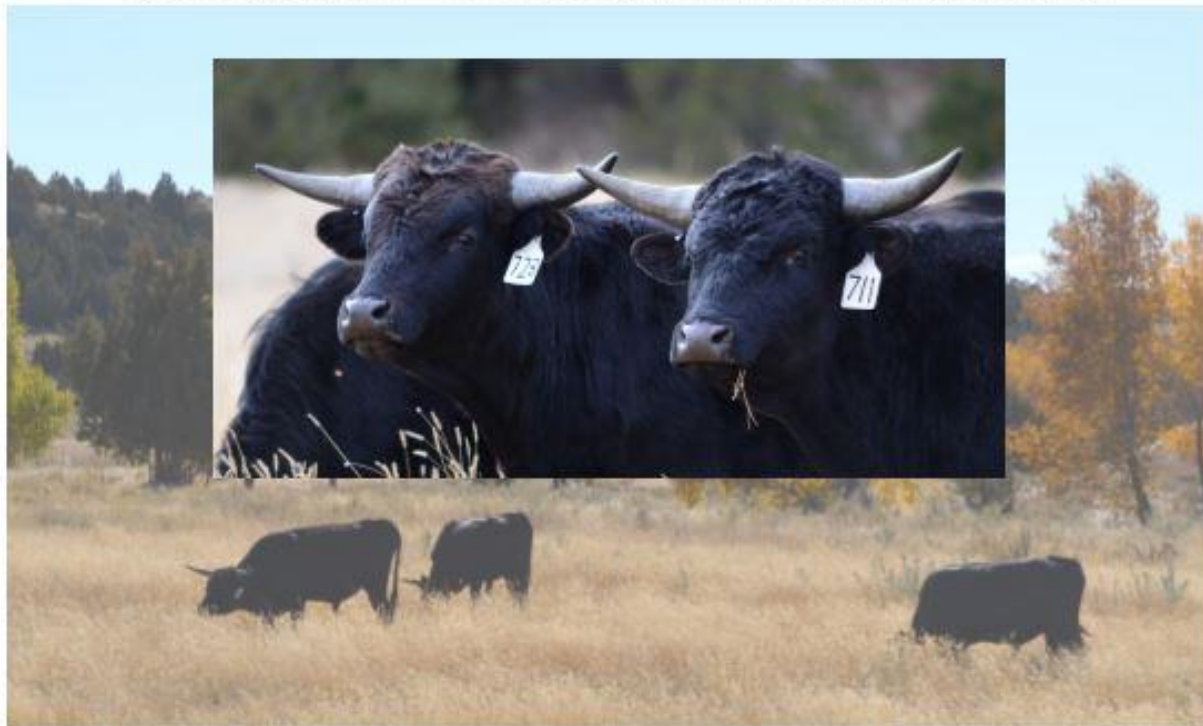

Back in October of 1982, the first initial meeting of the board of directors was held at Felt & Martin Law Offices in Billings, Montana. Officers elected were, Tucker Ashley-President, Fred Knoblick-Vice President, Larry Martin-Secretary/Treasurer. Also present was Bill Mundorf, board member. All registrations were done by visual inspections.

Here are some special milestones from the very early years.....

January 1984-The first issue of *The Corriente Corresponder* is created.

April 1986-First Annual Cattle Show, Sale, and Roping in Gillette, Wyoming. Judges were Marvin Knutson, Les Coates, and Miles Torske

April 1987-The steer, drawn by Bill Mundorf, is adopted as the official NACA logo.

August 1987-First advertising campaign in the *Western Horseman* in conjunction with an article of Charlie Daniel's Twin Pines Ranch. This was an immediate sure in memberships.

January 1990-Visual Inspection for females ends.

April 1990-National Convention in Wendover, Nevada

1991-The 5000th corriente was registered (purebred and percentage)

1992-First judging guidelines were published.

1994-10,000th corriente was registered. The convention was in Brighton, Colorado

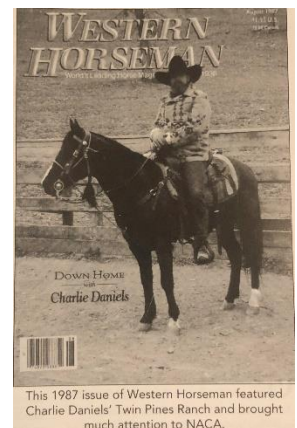
1996-15,000th corriente was registered. The convention was in Shawnee, Oklahoma

1997-Convention in Shawnee, Oklahoma. PRCA roper Bobby Harris was the educational speaker.

2000-The NACA is on the worldwide web. 30,000th corriente registered.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO REGISTER YOUR CATTLE?



Registering your cattle will increase the value of the herd well beyond the cost of the registration fees. Buyers place a premium on the knowledge that your herd does not include the genetics of other breeds. Registration certificates and the accompanying pedigree back up the legitimacy of your herd and provide a history of each animal.

These days there is an enormous demand for roping cattle and supplies are low. Cattle of any quality are fairly easily marketed, including obvious cross bloods. As the market inevitably turns around, as it has in the past, the best pureblood cattle retain the highest market value and are still in great demand. These cattle are considered the best due to careful herd management and production records encouraged by the North American Corriente Association and taught through educational articles and research.

Generally speaking, registered heifers and bulls sell for 20-40% more than commercial cattle, and can bring much more than that. A well-managed herd produces remarkably even, dependable, athletic roping steers and most breeders enjoy repeat buyers who pay a premium.

Finally, pureblood Corrientes retain the traditional traits of the original Spanish cattle brought to the Americas. They are hardy, disease resistant, efficient foragers and free of calving problems. The registry itself is the headquarters for the preservations of this heritage breed, and by supporting it through the registration of your cattle you will be contributing to the promotion, conservation, and the research of the corriente breed.

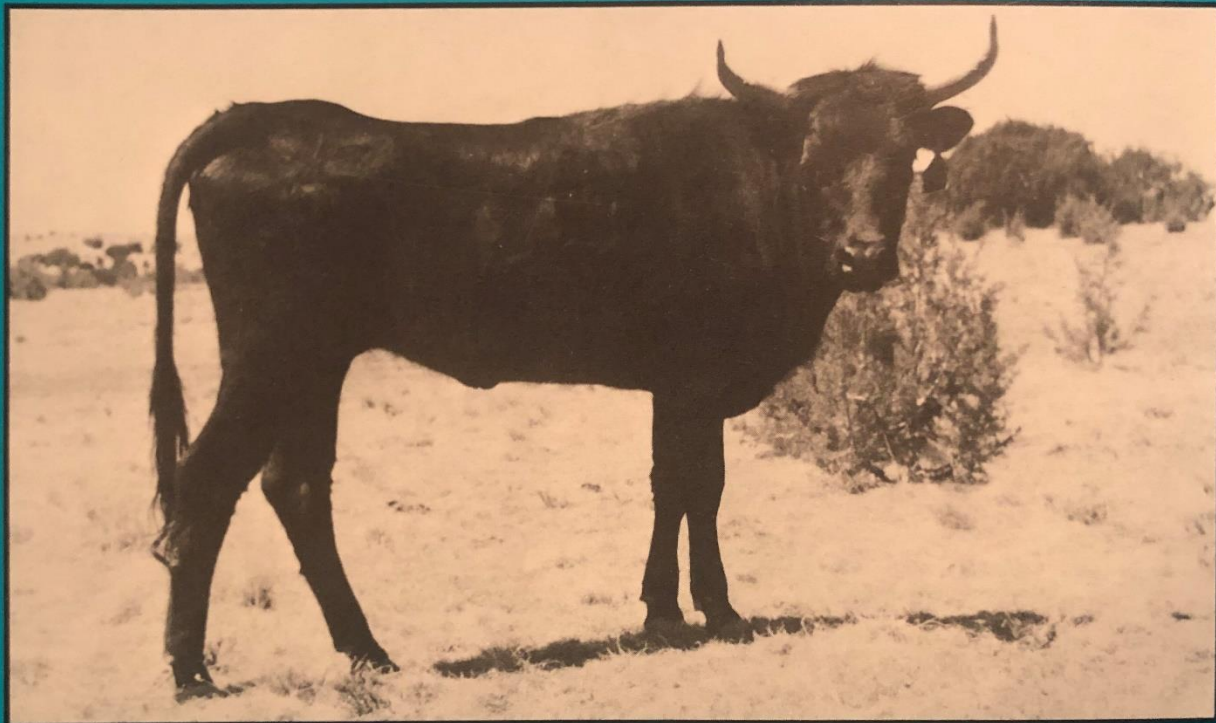

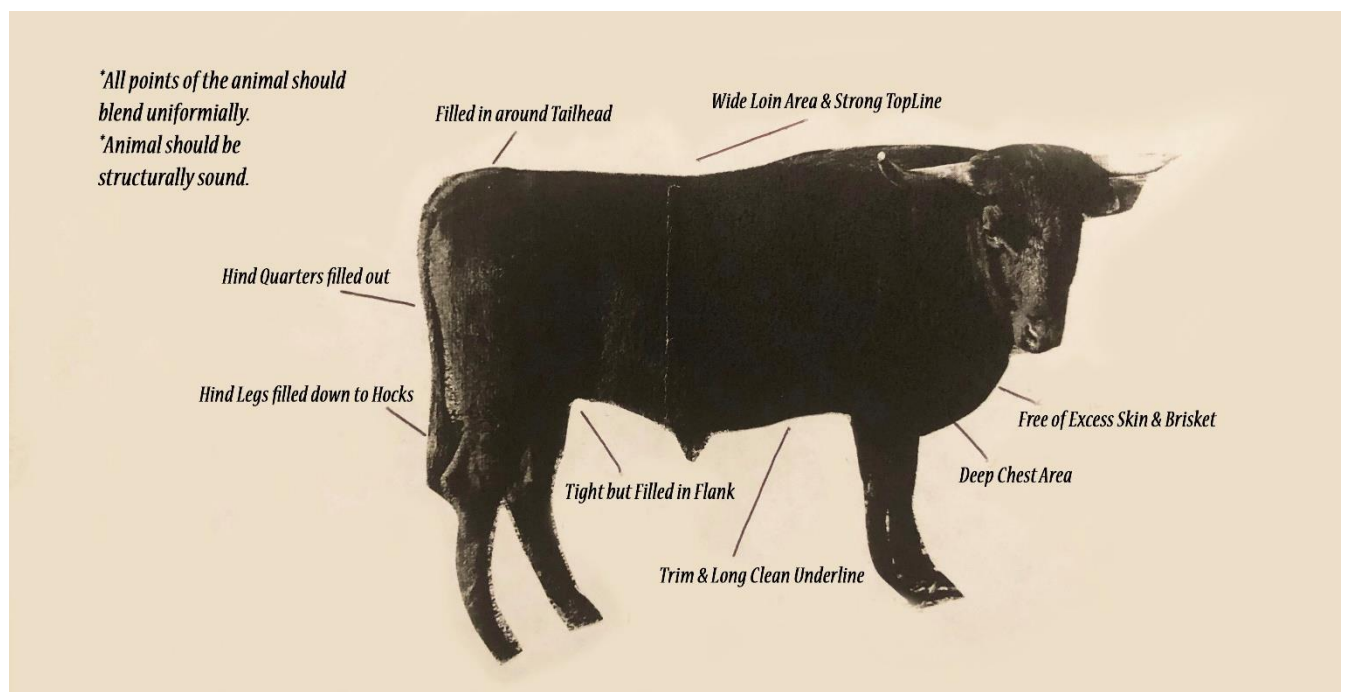
Criteria for the Certified Corriente Beef Program

This program was started in 2020, and still evolving. The NACA has trademarked the CCB logo for all members of the program to use. Below are the criteria of an ideal corriente beef ready to butcher compared to what judges look for when judging a NACA confirmation class.

Corriente Market Beef

The object of all market animals is to produce a carcass that results in the maximum amount of lean meat yield with a minimum amount of waste fat.

An ideal corriente beef animal is a combination of many factors. Market beef should be structurally sound. Conformation does play a part in corriente market beef, with an overall meat covering of the animal. The beef should be smooth and balanced from one end to the other.

From the side, the ideal animal should be free of extra leather in the neck and brisket area. The middle should be trim, with a clean long underline. The flank should not be excessively deep. Extra depth and excessive fullness to the flank is nothing but waste fat. The animal should have a thick strong muscular top and wide loin area. A short-coupled animal will result in excessive belly fat and waste. Look for a longer leaner animal, there will be less waste.

The ideal market steer or heifer should be:

- 1. A structurally sound animal.**
- 2. Free of extra skin leather in the throat area, brisket and dunlap.**
- 3. The middle should be trim, with a long clean underline.**
- 4. The top line should be clean and long, with a wide loin area.**
- 5. Extra depth and excessive fullness to the flank is nothing but waste fat.**
- 6. All points of the animal should blend into the next part.**
- 7. The peaked tail head should be filled in and blend into the loin area.**
- 8. Market or butcher weight will be up to the owner as some cattle develop and mature out quicker than others.**
- 9. Different regions of the country will have different aspects of the conformation guidelines.**

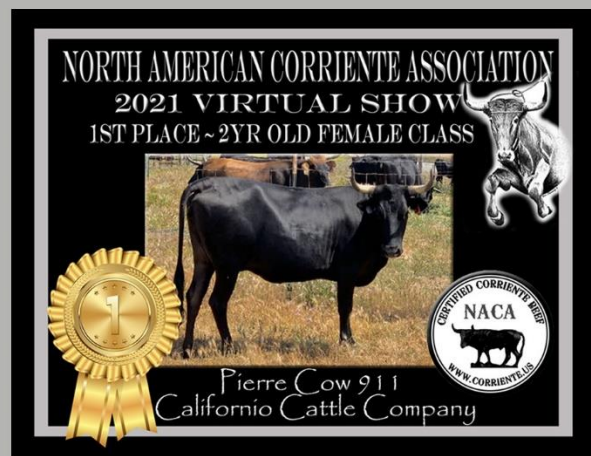

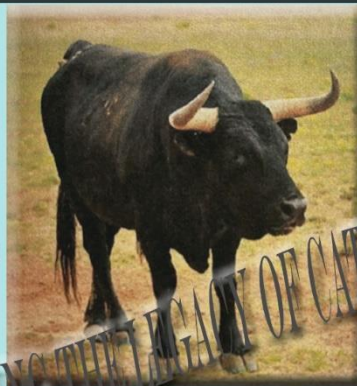
