

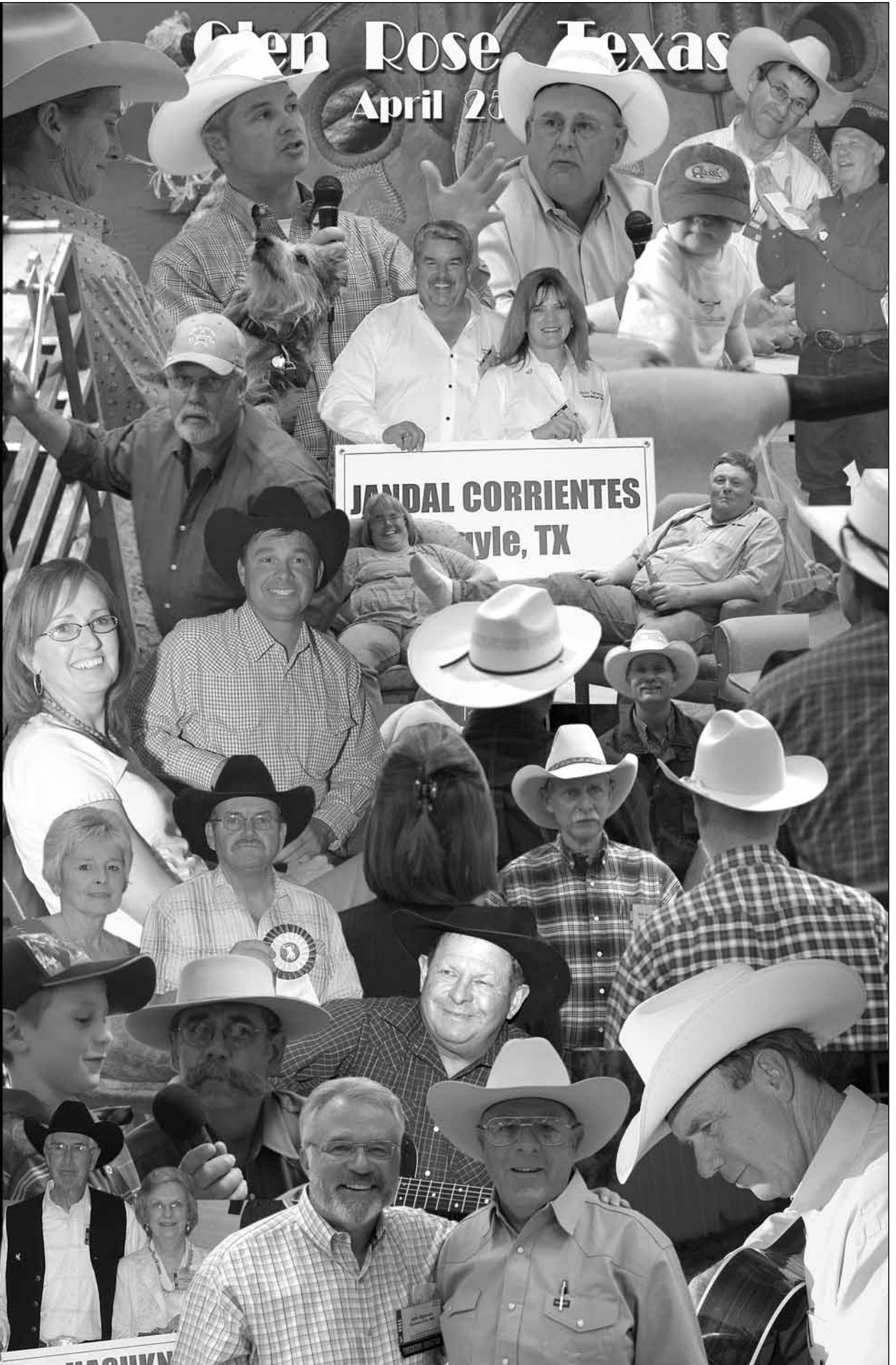

# Records Were Made To Be **BROKEN**

Whoever coined the phrase, "Records were made to be broken," surely knew what they were talking about. Recent history includes a record number of NACA members, a new record for registrations processed in 2006, and record numbers of show cattle and entries. Last year's National Show and Convention in Cortez, Colorado, set a new all-time record with nearly 350 animals and 528 class entries. That record only held until the 2007 show season kicked off in Stephenville, Texas. The 2007 TCCA show set another new record with 352 head of cattle and 587 class entries. But TCCA's claim to fame was short-lived, as the 2007 National Show in Glen Rose, Texas, topped the records yet again with 623 class entries and 369 head of cattle.

The record numbers of cattle required nearly 200 pens to house them all. Guess what? That's another record. Show Manager Mel Gnatkowski's superb pen layout was turned into a merely good pen layout when an alley had to be sacrificed to create more pens. A seasoned Show Manager, Mel knows the ins, outs and pitfalls that come with putting on a Corriente show. He masterminded a sound budget, a good schedule and a workable plan to handle the record numbers. Many members jumped in and

helped out, making the event move smoothly and stay on schedule. Special thanks are due to Wayne and Stacy Lynn. Their proximity to the venue made them invaluable members of the show team, and they are probably now considered honorary citizens of Glen Rose, as many times as they came to town on show business. Stacy served as liaison with the Chamber of Commerce, and also was able to procure a record (there's that word again) number of sponsorships from Glen Rose and the surrounding community. Between entries and sponsor ads, the National Show program exploded to 96 pages. And yes, that's a record, too.

The first scheduled event, aside from check-in, was a Board meeting on Tuesday. There was a large agenda for the Board to handle. The most pressing business was the National Show itself. Applications from Central States for 2008 and PNCA for 2009 were reviewed and discussed. Preliminary discussion was favorable although an official vote has yet to be taken. (see Director Notes). Severe weather rolled in that evening, with serious storm damage and flash flooding in nearby towns. But rain, wind and small hail was as bad as it got in Glen Rose.

Wednesday, April 25, was busy with check-ins and the start of the conformation classes, Get of Sire and Produce of Dam. Twenty-two Get of Sire groups were carefully evaluated by bull judge Roy Elsner. Female judge, Jay Mathews, overcame an air travel nightmare to arrive just in time for his first class, Produce of Dam. Jay had an easier start with "only" 11 entries. That evening was the Welcome Reception, and everyone seemed to enjoy the tasty finger food and socializing. The Wau-Ban-See Cantina opened for business and a good jam session was held.

Thursday saw the remaining conformation classes. The Junior Yearling Heifer class was yet another record-maker with 62 entries in the show ring. The placings were spread around among many different exhibitors and Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor points racked up throughout the day. The largest Corriente show ever held concluded the conformation classes on time, and the Annual Membership Meeting followed. Members received reports on the show, NACA activity, finances, and a thorough update of the Long Range Plan. Ballots were distributed to members present who had not voted by mail. When the votes were tallied, the members had chosen to re-elect Kinnan Golemon, Brady, Texas, for a second term and returned Lyndell Petersen, Hermosa, South Dakota, to the

Board. After the meeting adjourned, many members stayed for an open forum discussion with the Board. Many ideas were introduced, and one that was immediately adopted was to name the member's jam session the Jack Cates Jam Session, and to leave a chair open in the front row in honor of Jack.

The Performance classes were held on Friday, April 27. Mel's concept of splitting the bull and heifer roping classes into age groups worked very well. The nearness of Glen Rose to the "Cowboy Capital" meant that the performance cattle were showcased by some very talented and also well-known ropers for the performance judge, Jimmy Garcia. In order to better reward these ropers, the show budget was adjusted and funds originally earmarked for paid labor to help move cattle were instead used for incentives for the ropers for the most catches. A sanctioned Bulldogging Steer class was also held this year, which is never easy to accomplish.

Saturday, April 28, was all about roping for the members. The Breeder's Roping

led off, with Krys Gnatkowski winning one of the top-notch trophy saddles by Cowboy Classic Saddlery. This may well be another – you guessed it – record, as Krys is likely the youngest breeder to ever win a breeder's trophy saddle (although ages are not officially recorded). Congratulations, Krys! Jay Mathews won the other saddle on a borrowed horse, a testament to his skill. Second place header and heeler in the Breeder's Roping received Gist buckles. Three sessions of member roping followed, #9, #11 and #12, with cash and buckles up for grabs. Ropes, courtesy of Fastback, were awarded for the fastest time in each roping. See page 22 for full roping results. Some of the show cattle served double-duty as roping stock for the members, with around 60 head making the runs all day. Future herd sires and matron cows among them, proving that a good roping performance is in their genes. While the roping was in progress, the cattle were also being evaluated to determine the \$1,000 Roping Class cash award winners.

Many members expressed their pleasure with the educational opportunities offered this year. A brand new event, the 2006 suggestion of Judy Kuhlman Peterson, was a judging seminar. Judging clinics have been held in the past, but for this one, participation was limited and the format changed so participants could receive up-close-and-personal instruction from the judges. Judges Roy Elsner, Duke Sundt and Jeff Poole worked with the participants in small groups, rotating between bull, female and performance judging.

Kirk Bray and Mike Qualls of USTRC were guest speakers. Both were gracious enough to stay for some question-and-answer with the attendees. The ideas and information exchanged were very thought-provoking.

Saturday evening's Award banquet brought the event to a close. The banquet room was decorated very nicely by Stacy Lynn, 2D Nourse, Christy Jordan and Jacqueline Golemon, providing a pleasant atmosphere for dinner and awards. Corriente breeders...in Texas...what else could be served but barbecue? The food was good, especially the home-made pecan pie offered for dessert.

President Kinnan Golemon served as master of ceremonies, announcing results and calling the winners up front for recognition and awards. The trophy buckles, made by Gist Silversmiths, received many compliments. The Grand Champion awards, bronzes by Duke Sundt, are exceptional and sure to be treasured by their new owners. A special presentation was made to retiring Board member Randy Huston, who received a custom buckle, along with a standing ovation, for his six years of service to NACA. Randy's legacy includes his leadership on the newest edition of the promotional breed brochure, the RFD-TV program and promotional video, and many good ideas for the national print advertising campaign. Mel Gnatskowski was presented with a certificate for a custom-made 20X hat. And Wayne and Stacy Lynn received a great pair of lamps for their new home.

Of all the words in the English language, "great" seems to best describe this event. A great facility; great show; great awards; not to mention a gathering of great people. If you were unable to attend this year's National Show & Convention, you really did miss a great one.

Best wishes for successful and fun events to the regions whose shows are yet to come. Members, please come out and support your region and your national association. Members who are active and informed are the best asset any organization can have. When everyone pulls together, great things happen.
